CAVS LOOK TO REBOUND FROM TRIP TO WEBBER INTERNATIONAL

Last week, UVA-Wise fell 30-10 on the road against Webber International. In that contest, the Cavaliers were unable to stop Torrance Moise. Moise, the Warriors quarterback ran for 144 yards while passing for 190 more. In total, Moise posted 234 yards of total offense and two touchdowns.

For UVA-Wise, it was a sluggish day in all facets of the game. The Cavaliers managed just 152 yards of offense for the game. UVA-Wise was also penalized for 95 yards in the defeat.

Despite the struggles, the Cavs had several opportunities to close the Warriors lead. Trailing 10-3 at half, the Cavs had appeared to stop the Warriors on a key third down in the 3rd quarter. However, on a fourth down punt, UVA-Wise was called for an illegal participation penalty. The 15 yard penalty moved the ball to the UVA-Wise side of the field and kept Webber International's drive alive. Five plays later, Taylor Atwood scored from one yard out to give the Warriors a two score advantage.

From that point, the UVA-Wise offense responded with its best drive of the day. A 12 play 65 yard drive that resulted in a touchdown. Vance Gibbs ran for 13 yards on the drive's opening play to move the ball to the UVA-Wise 48 yard line. One play later, Nick Leftwich scrambled for 25 yards; which moved the ball to the Warriors 38. Two plays later, Stewart Robertson rushed for 13 yards on the quarter's final play to give UVA-Wise a first down at the Webber 24 yard line. The Cavalier offense would move into the red zone when Leftwich rolled right to find a sliding Dominique Simmons on a curl route. The play was good enough for 17 yards. After failing to move the ball on first and second down; Leftwich rolled left and found a leaping Michel Steele in the back of the end zone, Allen Owens added the extra point and the Cavaliers trailed 23-10 with 12:39 in the contest.

After fighting to get back into the contest, the Cavaliers surrendered a 91 yard touchdown run on the Warriors first play from scrimmage. From that point, the Warriors used a ball control offense to run out the clock and secure the 30-10 victory.

Today marks the first game of the season for Campbell. The Camels are a NCAA program that competes in the Atlantic Sun Conference. The Camels went 3-8 one year ago. Campbell's football program is in its third year of existence after taking a five decade absence.

CAVS MUST STOP CAMELS OPTION ATTACK

A talented option attack enters Carl Smith Stadium on Saturday. The Campbell Camels averaged nearly 190 yards per game on the ground in 2009. Last year, the Camels used a four headed rushing attack. Campbell returns its top four leading rushers in 2010. The quartet featured four freshman last season. Quarterback Daniel Polk, joins returning running backs C.J. Oates, Carl Smith, and Rashaun Brown in the backfield. Polk finished the season with 572 yards while Oates averaged 5.5 yards per carry in his 567 yard season. Meanwhile, Smith and Brown combined to carry the ball 145 times for 757 yards and seven touchdowns.

The Camels implement a triple option attack taking advantage of Polk's playmaking ability; Polk will either give the ball on a dive play up the middle, pitch the ball, or keep the ball himself around end. A staple of the offense, Campbell rushed the ball on 463 of 716 plays from scrimmage a year ago.

UVA-WISE QUARTERBACKS BACK FOR ROUND TWO

A week after Nick Leftwich and Hunter Hoke got their first extended playing time in a collegiate football game the duo will look to improve on last week's performance. Against Webber International the combo combined to throw for 49 yards on 7 of 20 passing. In the third quarter, Nick Leftwich completed his first touchdown pass of his UVa-Wise career when he found Michel Steele in the left corner of the end zone. The score and subsequent extra point cut the Webber lead to 10 at 20-10. The young signal callers should have an opportunity to air it out a bit this week. A year ago, Campbell surrendered over 175 yards passing per game to go along with 15 touchdown passes allowed on the season.

UVA-WISE RUNNING BACKS GET FEET WET

A week ago, UVa-Wise saw five running backs get their first carries in a Cavalier uniform. Stewart Robertson, K.J. Ford, Vance Gibbs, Andre Dickerson, and Ryan Bouldin all played in the season opener against Webber. On the day, UVa-Wise tailback's carried the ball 24 times for 88 yards. Sophomore K.J. Ford led the rushing attack for UVa-Wise. The Elliston,
